

Crime Reduction Grants Awarded for FY2026*

Coordination of Law Enforcement & Treatment

11th JD: Farmington Police Department San Juan Domestic Violence Support, \$15,750.00

Provided funding for alternative housing and support services in domestic violence cases through emergency hotel vouchers.

Evidence-Based Prevention, Treatment & Supervision

1st JD: LOPD Warrant Forgiveness Walk-In Program, \$35,000.00

Provided funding for advertisements and equipment for three Warrant Forgiveness Walk-In events in Santa Fe.

2nd JD: LOPD Warrant Forgiveness Walk-In Program, \$30,000.00

Provided funding for advertisements and equipment for three Warrant Forgiveness Walk-In events in Bernalillo County.

6th JD: Luna County Pathways to Success Program, \$49,515.00

Provided funding to provide at-risk youth in the Sixth Judicial District with essential resources and services, including academic support, basic necessities, and personal development opportunities.
