

## Crime Reduction Grants Awarded for FY2025

### Coordination of Law Enforcement & Treatment

#### **2<sup>nd</sup> JD: Bernalillo County Sheriff's Office Data-Driven Policing, \$55,250.00**

Provided funding to improve the Crime Analysis unit's operations through technology, software, and training to help improve processing times of data.

#### **5<sup>th</sup> JD: Fifth Judicial District Attorney's Office Evidence Portal, \$135,000.00**

Provided funding to implement the NICE Justice Digital Evidence System, a cloud-based software platform, to streamline the processes of maintaining, sharing, and utilizing the large amounts of digital evidence required for the delivery of timely justice.

#### **13<sup>th</sup> JD: Valencia County Detention Center Radios/Broadband, \$30,000.00**

Provided funding to address communication shortfalls and enhance the local broadband to increase the level of education delivered to detainees and allow them better access to reentry services.

#### **13<sup>th</sup> JD: Valencia County Detention Center Medicated Assisted Treatment, \$175,000.00**

Provided funding to hire a case manager, implement strategies to recruit and retain staff, and expand software to ensure the sharing of information after discharge to treatment providers.

### Crisis Intervention Teams

#### **6<sup>th</sup> JD: Luna County Active Shooter Training, \$75,000.00**

Provided funding to acquire virtual active shooter training equipment designed to enhance intervention and de-escalation skills.

#### **6<sup>th</sup> JD: Hidalgo County Community Response Team, \$79,000.00**

Provided funding to assist local teams in development and execution of pilot projects aimed at improving the court and community response to those with mental illness and substance misuse intervention needs.

### Evidence-Based Prevention, Treatment & Supervision

#### **2<sup>nd</sup> JD: Bernalillo County Warrant Forgiveness Walk-In Program, \$48,000.00**

Provided funding for advertisements and equipment for three Bernalillo County Warrant Forgiveness Walk-In events.

#### **5<sup>th</sup> JD: Lea County Community Drug Coalition Services, \$54,300.00**

Provided funding for the Community Drug Coalition of Lea County's program to provide pathways to recovery for individuals struggling with substance abuse through counseling, Intensive Outpatient Programs, and community-based support.

#### **13<sup>th</sup> JD: Resource Assessment Center Program, \$351,100.00**

Provided funding for a Resource Assessment Center who have had police contact or are considered at-risk of police contact. The Center is focused on decreasing contact with law enforcement by assessing clients' needs and strengths and providing case management services.

### Pre-Prosecution Diversion

#### **2<sup>nd</sup> JD: Second Judicial District Attorney's Office Pre-Prosecution Diversion Program, \$635,000.00**

Provided funding for removing low level offenders from the criminal justice system and placing them into treatment and rehabilitation services.

#### **8<sup>th</sup> JD: Taos LEAD, \$150,000.00**

Provided funding for DreamTree Projects to create a Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) program to assist individuals struggling with substance use disorder who are identified and referred by law enforcement.

### Pretrial Service Program

#### **1<sup>st</sup> JD: Pretrial Peer Support, \$42,774.29**

Provided funding to hire a certified peer support worker to assist individuals charged with a criminal offense in the district court with complying with conditions of release.

**2<sup>nd</sup> JD: Bernalillo County Metropolitan Court Probation Division Specialty Training, \$12,303.64**

Provided funding for specialized training for the Bernalillo County Metropolitan Court's Probation Division through the American Probation and Parole Association.

**4<sup>th</sup> JD: Fourth Judicial District Court Pretrial Justice, \$40,000.00**

Provided funding for GPS units and monitoring for pre-trial defendants.

**8<sup>th</sup> JD: Taos Pre-Adjudication Support, \$53,246.00**

Provided funding for DreamTree Project to launch a Pre-Adjudication Support pilot project designed to support coordination between the justice system and behavioral health providers.

**Re-Entry**

**2<sup>nd</sup> JD: Re-Entry Center Liaison LOPD Staffing, \$76,699.16**

Provided funding to staff the Resource Re-Entry Center with an LOPD paralegal who provides access to case management, transition plans, and transportation for individuals released from custody.

**3<sup>rd</sup> JD: (De)serving Life Reentry Project, \$20,000.00**

Provided funding to (De)serving Life to increase the hours of their Reentry Assistant and Reentry Coordinator positions, which allowed them to provide reentry services to additional parolees.

**11<sup>th</sup> JD: San Juan County Re-Entry Support, \$82,236.00**

Provided funding to assist individuals being released back into the community with transportation, housing, substance use treatment, and provide access to healthcare, mental healthcare, and recovery support services.

**Specialty Court Programs**

**2<sup>nd</sup> JD: Bernalillo County Metropolitan Court Remote Alcohol Monitoring Devices, \$40,150.00**

Provided funding for the Court to lease Remote Alcohol Monitoring Devices (SCRAM/CAM) and use a Transdermal 24/7 alcohol monitoring agency for these devices.

**2<sup>nd</sup> JD: Bernalillo County Metropolitan Court Specialty Courts Specialized Training, \$38,460.00**

Provided funding to provide specialized training required by the New Mexico Treatment Court Standards for all Specialty Court program managers and presiding judges.

**2<sup>nd</sup> JD: Bernalillo County Metropolitan Court Incentives for Treatment Programs, \$30,000.00**

Provided funding to purchase incentives for clients enrolled in Specialty Courts and the Behavioral Health Division Programs as well as light refreshments for graduation/recovery celebrations.
